



Whistle & Ivy

Peacock Feather Earrings

Pattern by Bethany {Whistle and Ivy}
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Embroidery floss:

- (1) Bright green: 906
 - (4) Forest Green: 520
 - (1) Tan: 436
 - (1) Electric Blue: 995
 - (1) Deep Royal Blue: 796
- 2 Mm hook

(Make four, two for each earring)

Start with Deep Royal Blue (796)

Magic ring

1. Sc 8 in ring. Join with sl st.
2. Sc 2 in each st around. Join with sl st. Tie off.

3. Join Electric Blue *in the st before the join*. Join with sl st.

Ch 1. Sc in same st. sc 2 in next st. (sc 1, sc 2 in next st) all around the circle, leaving the last st unworked. In the last st space, work 3 hdc into the foundation circle.(they will be very long) Join with sl st to first st. Tie off.

4. Join Tan *in the st before the join*. Join with a sl st. Sc in same st. (Sc 2. Sc 2 in next st.) work 2 times. Hdc. Dc . Dc 2 in next st. dc 2. dc 2 in next st. Dc. Hdc 2. Sc 2 in next st. (sc 2, sc 2 in next st) to the end of the round. Join with sl st. Tie off.

5. Join Bright Green *in the st before the join*. Join with a sl st. Ch 1. Sc in same st. sc 2. Sc 2 in next st. (sc 3, sc 2 in next st) for the rest of the round. Join with sl st. Tie off.

6. Join forest green *in the st before the join*. Join with a sl st. Ch 1. Sc in same st. sc 3. Sc 2 in next st. (sc 4, sc 2 in next st) twice. Hdc. Dc 2 in next st. Dc 4. Hdc 2 in next st. (sc 4, sc 2 in next st) for the rest of the round. Join with sl st.

7. Ch 1. Sc in same st. sc 18. Hdc 9. Sc 20. Join with sl st. Tie off.

Line your two pieces wrong sides together. Starting at the top an about 1 st to the left of the middle, join forest green with a sl st . Sl st all around, going through the two middle loops, the back loops of each st. Turn. Ch 3 and sl st into next st. Tie off.

To make the fringe, cut about 30 bits of floss, about 3 inches long. Using your hook, pull one end of the floss through the side, pulling the end to make it even. Tie a square knot to hold it in place. Continue around the bottom and up the sides of your earrings. After you have them all in place, trim them to give them a peacock feather shape. The floss is a bit wild and moves, so to hold it in place.
